



# NATO and Libya



## Operational Media Update 2 April 00.01 – 23.59

**3 April.** JFC Naples, SHAPE, NATO HQ

### **Mission**

On March 27, NATO decided to take control over all military operations for Libya under United Nations Security Council Resolutions 1970 & 1973. The aim of Operation UNIFIED PROTECTOR is to protect civilians and civilian-populated areas under attack or threat of attack.

The mission consists of three elements: an arms embargo, a no-fly-zone and actions to protect civilians from attack or the threat of attack.

Over the past 24 hours, NATO has conducted the following activities associated with Operation UNIFIED PROTECTOR:

### **Air Operations**

Since the beginning of the NATO operation (31 March 2011, 08.00GMT) a total of **547** sorties and **218** strike sorties\* have been conducted.

Sorties conducted 2 April: **184**

Strike sorties conducted 2 April: **70**

\*Strike sorties are intended to identify and engage appropriate targets, but do not necessarily deploy munitions each time.

### **Arms Embargo Activities**

A total of **21** ships under NATO command are actively patrolling the Central Mediterranean.

**4** Vessels were hailed on 2 April to determine destination and cargo. One boarding was required.

A total of **34** vessels have been hailed since the beginning of arms embargo operations.

### **Command and Control**

NATO's operational commander for Operation Unified Protector is **Lieutenant-General Charles Bouchard** of the Canadian Air Force. His office and staff is located at the Joint Force Command in Naples.
