Operational Media Update 4 April 00.01 – 23.59

Mission

On March 27, NATO decided to take control over all military operations for Libya under United Nations Security Council Resolutions 1970 & 1973. The aim of Operation UNIFIED PROTECTOR is to protect civilians and civilian-populated areas under attack or threat of attack.

The mission consists of three elements: an arms embargo, a no-fly-zone and actions to protect civilians from attack or the threat of attack.

Over the past 24 hours, NATO has conducted the following activities associated with Operation UNIFIED PROTECTOR:

Air Operations

Since the beginning of the NATO operation (31 March 2011, 08.00GMT) a total of **851** sorties and **334** strike sorties* have been conducted.

Sorties conducted 4 April: **150**

Strike sorties conducted 4 April: **58**

*Strike sorties are intended to identify and engage appropriate targets, but do not necessarily deploy munitions each time.

Arms Embargo Activities

A total of **18** ships under NATO command are actively patrolling the Central Mediterranean.

28 Vessels were hailed on 4 April to determine destination and cargo. 1 boarding was conducted.

A total of **76** vessels have been hailed and **2** boardings have been conducted since the beginning of arms embargo operations.

Total of Humanitarian Assistance ships last 24 hours were 5.

Command and Control

NATO's operational commander for Operation Unified Protector is **Lieutenant-General Charles Bouchard** of the Canadian Air Force. His office and staff is located at the Joint Force Command in Naples.
